NAVIGATION INFORMATION NETWORK (NAVINFONET)

The National Imagery and Mapping Agency (NIMA) has discontinued the Navigation Information Network (NAVINFONET) Service. Established in 1985, NAVINFONET has served the maritime community by providing continuous worldwide direct modem connection and access to NIMA maritime safety information databases. In July 1999, as part of the development and transition to operations of the Navigation Safety System (NSS), the NIMA Marine Navigation Website (<http://pollux.nss.nima.mil>) became operational. All NIMA maritime safety information will continue to be made available via the NIMA Marine Navigation Website to serve our maritime customers worldwide and carry forth the legacy of NAVINFONET into the 21st century. PUBLIC SALE OF NIMA NAVIGATION PUBLICATIONS TRANSFERRED TO THE GOVERNMENT
PRINTING OFFICE (GPO)

The National Imagery and Mapping Agency (NIMA) provides navigation publications for both civil and military customers. In the past, the printing of these publications was provided through the Government Printing Office (GPO) commercial printing contracts with public distribution accomplished via a cooperative agreement with the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Office of Aeronautical Charting and Cartography (now the FAA National Aeronautical Charting Office) and their selected resellers (sales agents). Effective 01 October 2000, NIMA has transferred the public sale of all new editions of NIMA navigation publications to the GPO, Superintendent of Documents (SuDocs) for both wholesale and retail purposes. All subsequent wholesale agreements for NIMA nautical publications must be established with GPO SuDocs.

This change will not affect the distribution of NIMA nautical charts and the U.S. Notice to Mariners.

All NIMA navigation publications offered for sale by the Superintendent of Documents may be ordered online, by phone or fax, or through the mail. Orders can be placed on the encryption-protected U.S. Government Online Bookstore (<http://bookstore.gpo.gov>), by phone (202-512-1800 from 7:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Eastern standard time, Monday through Friday), fax (202-512-2250, 24 hours per day), or regular mail. All orders may be paid for with MasterCard, VISA, or Discover/NOVUS, or a GPO Deposit Account. Mail orders must include either credit card or deposit account information, or a check payable to Superintendent of Documents. Designated book dealers recognized by GPO will receive a 25 percent discount on all domestic orders, **except those placed online**.
